WLCF honored with 2014 Nonprofit Achievement Award

Cindy Forsythe, WLCF board President, accepted the 2014 Nonprofit Achievement Award at the 8th Annual Siuslaw Awards banquet in January 2015. The award is given each year to a non-profit organization that demonstrates good stewardship of donor dollars and sound business practices while meeting commitment to its organization mission.

This award capped off a 40-year anniversary celebration of Western Lane Community Foundation giving back over 2,400,000 to charities, organizations, schools, hospital and students through grants and scholarships in the Florence, Mapleton, Dunes City and Deadwood area. WLCF, a 501(c)(3), was founded in 1974 with an initial investment of 3500 and manages over 5,000,000 in assets.

Geraldine Merz Fund (established 1980)

It has been written that Geraldine always had the "spirit of youth." She possessed the ability to relate with any age and nurturing a child's learning gave her great joy. She had a limitless intellectual curiosity in the world around her that reflected in the students she taught at Upper Fiddle Creek School in Ada. Geraldine lived in Florence for more than 50 years. She was active in Community affairs, including the Ada Grange, Western Lane Hospital Auxiliary, Siuslaw Parks and Recreation District, Siltcoos Home Extension Program, Friends of the Florence Library, AARP and the Presbyterian Church of the Siuslaw.



Her enthusiasm for life and what one person could accomplish was shared many times with her family, friends and acquaintances. With this in mind she made generous commitments of time and money to the community she loved.

Geraldine had always regretted not learning how to swim in Minnesota as a child, so in the late1970s when a couple of local youngsters had drowned, she decided that she would contribute funds to a taxing district that was being established to provide recreational activities, with an emphasis that her fund be used to build a swimming pool. She thought kids should have a good place to learn to swim.

in 1980 Geraldine established a fund with WLCF for use by the Siuslaw Parks and Recreation District. She wrote, "My wish is that this money, both principal and income it generates, be made available to the district to be used at its discretion, toward the accomplishment of a public swimming pool." Efforts to bring this about at the time were unsuccessful and dwindled most of her generous gift. Her instructions were that if the pool was not built in five years, any remaining money would go to the WLCF unrestricted fund, for use at the discretion of the board of directors. That provision took effect in 1991.



Since that time the Geraldine Merz Fund, with the help of her family who in 1997 and 1998 added to the fund, has consistently given grants to recreational youth summer programs and projects. Geraldine's legacy of community involvement has extended through her son Bob and his wife Shirley, their children Cindy Forsythe, Julie Hart, their children and Laura Merz.

Bob and Shirley Merz's wish for the future for the fund is to continue filling the void of recreational, educational and cultural opportunities for area youth in the summers. "We want to give something to the community that the schools can't provide."

Geraldine Merz Fund is a sustainable way to see that Geraldine's legacy and Bob and Shirley's wish be granted.

New Continuing Education Scholarships

Western Lane Community Foundation added five new \$1,000 WLCF Continuing Education Scholarships.

These scholarships are to address financial need for students of all ages who could use help in finishing their higher education, enter postgraduate programs and help adults returning to higher education due to career or family changes or job loss. 
