## Western Lane Community Foundation Awards Thirty-Nine Non-Profits Grants

2016 is proving to be a very good year for thirty-nine non-profit recipients covering most of western Lane County as WLCF grants checks totaling \$71,000. Recipients were awarded checks at the Rotary Club of Florence meeting on Tuesday, March 15. These funds will further their worthy projects that fall within the four Western Lane Community Foundation grant criteria areas of focus; Culture, Medicine/Science, Education, and Social/Civic Services. We received 56 applications requesting over \$176,000 in funds.

This year's grants covered a wide range of projects including partnering with the Central OR Coast Amateur Radio Club as they establish a emergency field deployable communications trailer, both Mapleton and Siuslaw School districts are benefiting by several projects funded to enhance the student's educational curriculum, like one on one computers and online academic subscriptions, both Mapleton and Siuslaw elementary receiving library books and Siuslaw district received a grant to replace the audiometer for conducting hearing evaluations which they will be sharing with Mapleton as well. Florence and Mapleton Food Share received funds to help maintain and upgrade their equipment vital to serving the needy.
